Currently working as a portrait artist, Chris originally majored in nursing and spent three decades as the wife of a career Naval Officer and mother of two. At age 16, Chris was introduced to watercolor and has been painting in this medium since that time. She has always been interested in

peoples' stories and in capturing that story when painting their portraits. Currently, she is painting a series based on her father's journey through dementia and has completed 5 paintings in that series — some of which she will bring to show.

Having taught at OSA a number of years ago, Chris looks forward to returning and giving a demonstration. She will be talking about some ways to improve your portrait paintings, including anatomical references and she will show the way she applies color to create dynamic, colorful portraits. She will also demonstrate how to paint eyes. This will be a "little taste" of the workshop that Chris and Rene Eisenbart will join together in teaching at Menucha, October 30th through November 4th, called "Dynamic Portraits with the Duo".

Chris loves teaching and the interaction she has with her students. She is always interested in giving away what she has learned and watching others mature in their ability to master this magical medium. Currently she teaches out of her studio and in workshops in various parts of the country.

JANET PARKER: "BOTANICAL ILLUSTRATION IN COLORED PENCIL"

Janet Parker's studio is filled with light and her botanical subjects are curated gems in the white space. One wall has workstudies of clematis for the Lan Su Chinese Garden and vintage botanical posters. A single chrysanthemum that caught her attention, was brought back to her studio and stands gaily in a water glass on her worktable. A pinecone lays in a lid next to its graphite rendition showing her attention to the precise details and shifts of light that play across textures and lines. Her work is thoughtful, true to her subject and breathtaking in its luminosity and accuracy.

Come join others during this demo, as Janet gives a comprehensive lecture about the history of botanical illustration along with a physical timeline. She will share examples of her own work in process.

Janet Parker earned her Certificate in Botanical Art studying with Wendy Hollander at the New York Botanical Garden. She worked as an art director for numerous publications in New York City and then moved to Portland after taking a job with Tin House, where she worked until 2012. Janet now focuses on her own work and teaching. She is the founder of Oregon Botanical Artists.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



The opening of the new Gallery Two show today was memorable. This collaboration with Soka Gakki International and the Physicians for Social Responsibility was an exhibit to commemorate Hiroshima and Nagasaki, organized for OSA by Linda Church and Cindy Lommasson. It featured the art of Yukiyo Kawano, an artist born in Hiroshima and now living in Portland. Her full-sized replica of the "Little Boy" bomb was constructed of silk and hung from the ceiling. A number of paintings of kimonos by Yukiyo from which the silk patterns were derived, hung on the walls of the gallery to provide context. The exhibit had a quiet, fragile beauty, and a sense of the deepest irony.

I was reminded at this exhibit that "the performing and visual arts are not a luxury in a free and democratic society" but "symptoms of its existence." (Leon Boystein, President of Bard College)

ERIK SANDGREN: COLOR, LIGHT AND SPACE - WORKING WITH ACRYLICS AND AQUEOUS MEDIA

Saturday and Sunday, September 24 and 25, 9am - 4pm both days, \$250

Washington artist, printmaker and educator Erik Sandgren believes that acrylics and other aqueous media offer tremendous advantages and versatility for an evolving painting process. In this workshop, Erik will show you his techniques for manipulating the paint film in unorthodox ways such as glazing, scratching, scuffing, and abrading. He has many strategies to share about materials and techniques, driven by each student's desire for expression based on color and composition. There will be daily demonstrations, with group and individual conversations, all interspersed with looking at some master paintings. Bring your favorite water-based materials and tools, along with your sketchbooks and suitable supports (panels, paper or canvas). He suggests also bringing one failed, stalled or abandoned painting in acrylic or another aqueous medium- the objective is for everyone in the workshop to take away something useful that will inspire a fresh take on his or her work. SOON Y. WARREN: PAINTING VIBRANT WATERCOLORS
